Ko Young-Hoon

Ko Young-Hoon(1952~) was born in Jeju Island, and completed both his BFA and MFA from the Department of Painting in the College of Fine Art at Hongik University. He introduced hyper-realistic works depicting stones in the 2nd 《Indépendan》 Exhibition in 1974. His participation in the 6th India Triennale and the 42nd Venice Biennale made him one of the most representative artists in Korean Hyper-realism. He had solo exhibitions at the Duson Gallery in Seoul and the Alain Blondel Gallery in Paris from 1985 to 1993, He has worked exclusively with the Gana Gallery since the late-1990s. He won the Korean Art Journalist Award in 1987 and the Total Art Prize in 1991. He has established and maintained his international status through his participation in prestigious art faire such as the Basel Art Fair and the Chicago Art Fair, and in art markets through auction houses such as Christie's and Sotherby's.
